



FDR Memorial "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." Learn how Franklin D. Roosevelt reached out to the American people during the Great Depression while walking through the largest presidential memorial on the National Mall.



Arlington National Cemetery Honor the nearly 300,000 brave men and women who sacrificed their lives for our country. Take part in one of our country's greatest traditions with the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.



Iwo Jima Memorial Think about the inscription, "Uncommon valor was a common virtue," while you explore this tribute to the U.S. Marines who died while serving our country during the Battle of Iwo Jima against the Japanese in February of 1945.



White House (picture stop) Stop in front of America's most famous house, the home of the current U.S. president and the first family, and take a picture with your friends. George Washington himself chose the site in which the White House now rests in 1791.



U.S. Capitol Visit the hallowed halls where our laws are made and follow in the footsteps of many of our Founding Fathers. See the architectural beauty of this historic building, and meet with some of its modern inhabitants.



WWII Memorial Deepen your appreciation for the 16 million men who served and 400,000 who lost their lives in battle while fighting to protect our rights and freedoms. Let it inspire you as a symbol of the unity of an entire nation.



Korean War Veterans Memorial Walk among 19 statues, each depicting a soldier in realistic garb, as they march through Korea's rough terrain during the Korean War. Run your fingers along the wall that names those who served.



Washington Monument (picture stop) Snap some photos with your friends in front of the world's tallest stone monument built to honor our nation's first president whose outstanding leadership set the bar high for all following presidents.
