A Tour Director shares her private Italy with students—and helps them make it theirs, too

Meet Elisabetta Amadi



"It's very difficult for me to see myself anywhere else," she shrugs. "Home is always home."

Elisabetta Amadi's favorite part of the job is showing you her Venice—the one she grew up in from childhood. As a Tour Director, Elisabetta spends much of her life traveling with groups in Greece, France, the UK, and throughout Italy. She's lived all over the world. But when she returns to Venice, there is an inescapable feeling of home.

Venice has been home for Elisabetta's family for generations. Half of the family escaped from Spain in the 1500s. The other half is from Burano, the tiny island in the Venetian Lagoon famous for its lace work.

"On my father's side, they build boats. On my mother's side, they are artists. I can walk into many galleries and shops and find their art on the walls," she says.

In today's Venice, there are few families like Elisabetta's left. Its sites and charm

have turned it into a tourist mecca and many locals—Elisabetta included have a complicated relationship with Venice's must-see status. "Venice is seen as "Veniceland" to some. For me, I always try as hard as I can to really give students something unique of my town. There aren't very many true residents of Venice—I may be one of the few that

can do this!"

"I sometimes take groups to my local ice cream place. I take them to the little self-serve where my grandmother used to take me when she got her pension, and we get lunch there. We have a house that has been in the family for decades. If I have a chance—I even bring them home."

Elisabetta's knowledge of the city facilitates students' learning and exploration in unique ways, including a LEAP activity she designed. "Kids are done listening to words quite quickly. It really is best to get them to move and to be active."

"It's like a treasure hunt. I divide the kids in groups—and get them to go at least five places with the help of a map. They have to find things and take pictures. For example, there is some very old graffiti on the Palazzo Ducale. Or I send them inside the Museo Correr to look for the oldest wedges that women used to use that go back to the 1700s," she describes.

These authentic moments help to encourage the students to find their Venice. "Recently, there were these six girls. I saw them come out of the ice cream place on their free time to go speak to some people around the corner in the fruit and vegetable store," Elisabetta says, with pride. Her Venice is now theirs too, and that means Elisabetta has helped yet another group of students appreciate what it means to feel at home around the world. "For me, I always try as hard as I can to really give students something unique of my town. There aren't very many true residents of Venice I may be one of the few that can do this!"

Meet Michael Edelstein



Customer champion for 23 years

Does he call himself a Travel Specialist? Well, maybe, but there's more.... Michael believes he's more like a Travel Addict. A former teacher and trip leader himself, he's been helping other teachers plan trips since 1995.

Q: The teachers you work with know you as a true believer in what we do. ...Not just travel in general, but educational travel, specifically. What drives that?

A: I think it's two things: what I've seen as a teacher, and what I didn't see as a student. When I was leading trips with my own students—I know it sounds cliché—the students changed! That's the simplest way to say it! Before the trip, they did work for my gradebook, but afterward, they did work for the world they'd end up in. As one parent put it, it was like giving them a magic potion. It was like a homework serum!

But I was late to the travel game. My first trip abroad was to Kenya, after

I graduated from college. It's crazy to think that I never traveled in high school or college. It would have so enhanced the value of my studies!

In my free time, I love to wander, but I also know I never learn as much then as I do when traveling on one of the programs we offer.

Q: What's your favorite part of the planning process?

A: I really love working with teachers to develop the kind of trip that matches their teaching philosophy and process: Interactive. Student-centered. Meaningful. Just going to the sites—anybody can do that! It's that next level that I think is a fascinating one. Q: Share some pro tips. What's something you wish teachers knew before they planned their first trip? A: I wish first-time planners knew that leading their trips will be far easier and less threatening than they expect. Just like the teacher specializes in classroom teaching, WorldStrides specializes in making travel a true educational extension of classroom learning. It's actually a kind of firsthand discovery, anywhere in the world!

Lots of time and thought and attention goes into it. And a huge part of that is collecting the feedback of our teachers and our Tour Directors over the years to fine tune our support of the enrollment process and how we design and run the trips. Teachers sometimes worry about how things will play out. We're impressed with that kind of concern, because it shows they're feeling responsible for the kids' safety, and also that they're delivering real educational quality to everybody concerned.

Q: What's your personal favorite place to visit?

A: That's tough for me, as everywhere is my favorite, but if I have to pick one... Machu Picchu. It exceeds your expectations even if you have high ones. I have a fear of heights, so my heartbeat goes a mile a minute. I've been three times and it never gets tiring.

A student's service learning travel experience sets the stage for her career

Read the story of a student whose dual passions for Latin America and service began with her 12th grade trip to Peru more than 10 years ago. Today, she is the Field Director for a non-profit organization called Partners in Development. They serve needy families in Guatemala.

Meet Abby Sawyer

Student and Worldstrides traveler to Peru



Her high school trip to Peru actually took place in 2007, but Abby Sawyer talks about it now like she's telling a story from last month.

She vividly recalls exploring Machu Picchu, tasting traditional Peruvian cuisine, and hunting for alligators in the Amazon.

The week-long trip was led by her Spanish teacher, Ms. Kevan Sano, and it was Abby's first time in Latin America. Before traveling, Abby worked with Ms. Sano to organize a fundraiser to bring bags of school supplies to students in a locale high in the Andes. The memory of that school visit stands out in her mind as pivotal—it actually shaped her future.

Ms. Sano asked Abby to stand up in front of the class to present the students with computers that they'd brought as part of their fundraiser. "It was frightening.

"As scary as it was, I just started talking. And people were understanding! It wasn't perfect, but just to know they understood me...it motivated me more."

Abby went on to major in Spanish in college, and when the time came to study abroad, she chose to return to Peru. She spent a year living with a Peruvian family and studying at a small university. Six months after she returned to the United States, she graduated and accepted a position with Partners in Development in Guatemala. "I didn't know anybody. I just knew that I could speak Spanish, and I felt confident in that part," she says.

"As a teacher we rarely hear about how learning experiences have inspired students," notes Ms. Sano. "Occasionally I hear from a student about the impact of a trip or how learning Spanish has changed the direction of their lives."

Abby's direction hasn't just changed her life, it has broadened it, too! As field director for the nonprofit, Abby manages a medical clinic, a child sponsorship program, service trips, and an effort to build homes for the local families in the area. Two years ago, she married a young man from Guatemala. His family is now hers too, of course, and Abby marvels at how far her love of Latin American culture has come.

"I feel like I am part Guatemalan now. I feel like it has become a part of me.

She also credits some of her altruistic instinct to the example Ms. Sano set with the school fundraiser from 2007.

"I'm a big fan of maintaining the relationship—not just going once to drop off a donation," Abby says. "That instilled in me that, yes, we are going to this place, but we can also do something good. We aren't just going to be loud high school kids and take pictures, but to do something good."
