


## Thanks for downloading our tiled calendar!


Use these instructions to make it a snap to assemble and post on your wall.



## Instructions


	Start with the first row of pages. (Pages 1 and 2)			
<b>%</b>	Cut the second page along the dotted lines.			
	Apply glue to the colored area on the right side of the first page. Attach the second page to this area. (There will be a little bit of overlap, but that's ok! This ensures that your calendar will look great when finished.)			
	Repeat these steps for the second row. (Pages 3 and 4)			
	Once both rows are assembled, apply glue to the colored area at the bottom of the first row. Attach the second row to this area.			
	Trim the outside edges and you're finished!
