Fascinating facts you may not know about the Statue of Liberty



The statue's full name is Liberty Enlightening the World.

She holds a torch & tablet inscribed with **July 4, 1776**, the day the Declaration of Independence was signed.



Miss Liberty has a svelte, 35-foot waist measurement and wears an impressive **size 879 shoe.**

It takes 354 steep stairs to reach the top of the statue's crown.

The seven spikes on the crown represent the seven oceans and the seven continents.



Liberty's face is believed to be modeled after the sculptor's own mother. Charlotte.

In high winds of 50mph or more, Lady Liberty can sway by up to 3". **Her torch can even move 5"**.



Lady Liberty is thought to have been hit by about 600 of lightning every year.

Andy Warhol painted "Statue of Liberty" in the 1960s. It's worth around \$35,000,000! The cost of building the statue & pedestal amounted to just \$500,000.



While you can't see Liberty's feet clearly, she is standing around a broken shackle & chains with her right foot raised, which illustrates her moving forward, away from oppression and slavery.

The statue was used as a lighthouse for 16 years (1886-1902), lighting up to 24 miles away.
