Greg's lesson plan idea recap:

1. Allow for socialization

5. Bring guest speakers – host a mystery masked singer game, or bring in local musical talent
6. Work on repertoire – have students review and research using YouTube
7. Let them teach you – have them lead a session on a topic you've already covered
