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DAY 1 Good Day

Welcome to the old dart. Our local team will meet you at the airport and escort you to our hotel in London's still chic Soho district. Soho is the West End's lively night district packed with quirky boutiques, great restaurants, sophisticated bars and nightclubs of every persuasion. DAY 2 Yaas Queen Slay

We are going to hits the streets where we will be joined by a lifelike incarnation of Charles Dickens to lead us to some of his favorite watering holes. We will visit some of the oldest and most famous pubs in London, sites that were frequented by great 19th and 20th century poets and writers including Brendan Behan, Anthony Burgess, Karl Marx, George Orwell, Dylan Thomas, and Virginia Woolf. There will be a few reenactments of key moments in Britain's literary history and we'll hear of the incidents and mishaps that shaped some of British literature's most famous works all surrounded by living history.

- Sometime between 3000 BC and now, you might have heard of Stonehenge. Well, today is the day you get to actually see the standing stones. We'll hear all about the history of this British cultural icon and grab a few gram worthy shots before heading back into London. Been a long day so you deserve the night off.

DAY 5 *Towering over the City*

- ★ We hit the water today with a river cruise to catch some of the icons we haven't visited yet. Lots of great photo ops cruising under the London and Tower Bridges plus the city looks a bit different from the water. After lunch we venture to the O2 Arena to take in one of London's newest adventure activities. Strapped in, we walk the stairs to the top of the Arena for some fabulous views of the city.
